

Flight Club 502 Partial Scholarship Application

Flight Club 502, a 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization, has a limited number of \$500 Scholarships available for outstanding members. These Scholarships are renewable up to \$3000, based on the availability of funds and a recipient’s progress. Scholarships are to be directed toward aircraft use. Recipients are responsible for paying staff CFIs: \$35/hr for either ground or flight instruction.

Applicant Eligibility Requirements:

1. Current member in good standing with Flight Club 502 (FC502) at both the time of application and when the scholarship is awarded. (see www.flightclub502.org for membership details)
2. \$100 Jr. Scholarships: Members aged 13 – 15 ½.
3. \$500 Sr. Scholarships: Members aged 15 ½ - 21.
4. Candidates must be recommended by: OBAP, Bluegrass 99’s, EAA Chapter 110 or a Flight Club 502 CFI.
5. U.S. citizen or U.S. permanent resident.
6. Must be 16 for Solo Flight and 17 to take the FAA Practical Test check ride.
7. Jr. Scholarships require 6 hours of FC502 volunteer work including, but not limited to, the following: Aircraft Aesthetics, Building and Grounds Maintenance, etc.
8. Sr. Scholarships require 30 hours of FC502 volunteer work including, but not limited to, the following: Teaching Junior Flight Club and Intro to Aviation Classes, Aircraft Aesthetics, Building and Grounds Maintenance, Committee Work, Community Group Presentations to school groups and/or the FC502 Executive Board.
9. Provide (attach) a letter of recommendation from a Teacher, Scout Leader or Clergy Person.
10. Provide (attach) a copy of your most recent Semester Grade Report signed by your Principal.
11. Must have an FAA Flight Medical and FAA Student Pilot Certificate. (FC502 CFI will help.)
12. Scholarship recipients must be able to begin their flight training within 60 days of receiving the award.
13. Applicants and a parent or guardian must submit to a brief, 15-minute, interview with the Flight Club 502 Scholarship Committee. The Interview MUST include at least one parent or guardian.

Once selected and approved by the Flight Club 502 Scholarship Committee, the scholarship recipient will have to comply with the following additional requirements:

1. Submit regular training progress reports, signed off by your CFI, to the Flight Club 502 Scholarship Committee.
2. Submit regular 6-week School Progress Reports.
